Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) International Team

NFP International Clinical Advisory Group (CAG) Terms of Reference | January 2024

Purpose: To provide a forum where international Clinical Leads can collaborate, and be updated on, clinical developments to enhance the quality of NFP.

As a result:

- NFP is strengthened by the expertise and variety of experience brought by international clinical leads
- PRC-led developments and augmentations are aligned to the different contexts within which NFP is implemented internationally
- The principles and processes for implementing innovations are discussed
- Implementation challenges, common issues and potential solutions are shared between countries
- Priorities for NFP program developments/research reflect international evidence and experiences
- Research and enhancement/development projects/activities carried out by international partners are co-ordinated and learning shared
- Clinical issues held in common are explored and approaches across countries shared
- International projects are prioritized and developed in collaboration with CAG members

Scope:

- Issues relating to clinical implementation and development of the of NFP program
- International projects with a clinical or program implementation focus
- The individual country consultation for program license holders and/or clinical leader will continue to focus on unique/specific implementation issues, such as quality, expansion, and policy and system alignment.
- Discussions will feed into the wider Global Collaborative approach and specific, agreed-upon discussion points may be shared with GCGG.
- An appreciation that some countries have more resources than others so it is important to recognize that some participants may contribute in more depth to responding to discussion points.

Membership:

- One or two clinical lead(s) from each country (wherever possible a designated alternate should attend when the Clinical Lead(s) is unavailable)
- International team (David Olds, Gail Radford-Trotter, Elly Yost, Anna Lindberg)



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- Chaired by a member of the International Team

Meetings:

- Timing that aims to suit all international time zones as much as possible.
- 60–90-minute bimonthly and as needed. This time will not always be used, but it is available.
- The agenda will be sent in advance of the meeting. The agenda will be agreed upon, ideally several months in advance of the next meeting.
- Meeting calls will be recorded and posted on the NFP International website.
