Greetings, welcome and apologies/regrets

1. Agreed that without any representation from Australia, Northern Ireland, Bulgaria and Canada it would not be a decision-making forum, rather a discussion and plans for next steps.

2. Discussion to consider how best to ensure NFP community contributes to the article focussing on the role of NFP nurse in working with mothers whose child is to be removed. Key points;

- Agreed this important information to capture and has not been focussed on in any depth to date
- Dr Olds shared a case study of a mother with MH problems and the role of the nurse in helping her see she was unable to protect her child
- Similar cases could populate this article from NFP community
- Dr Olds proposed a survey then focus groups (Led by Professor Jacks team) to capture this information
- Areas to cover as well as capturing qualitative data where possible could be; Value of helping mothers recognise their inability to care for /protect their child, what the concerns /indicators were for the nurse (i.e. substance use, MH problems), what was the outcome for the child and



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what is the impact on the nurse engaging in this challenging work. What mitigates stress for the NFP nurse in these situations

• An appreciation of the challenge time wise for this work and the risk of over burdening NFP nurses with such a quick turn around

3.Actions; Gail to liaise with professor Jacks for support on progressing the above then write to the forum to update and ascertain interest in further contribution
