Update on GCGG Evaluation	 Meeting with David/Sue to discuss evaluation – Deirdre created report to outline happenings of the past 12 months Deirdre to share this report out to attendees (and other countries not part of GCGG) Overall: some countries really liked and benefited from the peer review process, great collaboration/sharing of ideas in other groups like CAG, education leads, data leads; other countries didn't feel that peer review process/GCGG fit their needs; England, Scotland, Norway withdrew from process. 12 months of GCGG
	 Completed peer reviews, a couple of countries just did the "traditional" annual review process, learned lots through the past year.
Discussion	 How can the frequency and agenda of GCGG meetings be optimized? Lindsay: Hard to assess frequency if not all countries are participating – quarterly probably still suitable, but depends on where we land in terms of optimizing agenda. Catherine: Quarterly meetings feel appropriate, great learnings from peer review process with Bulgaria, all meetings she attends have been helpful> these reflections may be because she's new to her role, she noted.
