





REFERRALS TO NFP



Most clients are still recruited by the Mediators of the program. About 26% of the clients now have been referred by current and graduated NFP clients. There have been more referrals from other service providers in the last year as well. The situation in Sofia and Plovdiv, however, is very different.

In the last year in <u>Sofia</u> 65% (11) of client were recruited directly by the NHVs and referrals came from NFP clients, compared to only 11% of enrolled clients in the previous two years, who have been referred by other clients. Other 35% (6)of enrolled clients come from NFP Mediators recruitment efforts.

In <u>Plovdiv</u> nearly 26 were recruited by NFP Mediators and 10 clients came from Clinicals/ Social workers. Previous clients recommended the program to 4 girls and 3 of them are enrolled.













PARTICIPANTS IN HOME VISITS




PARTICIPANTS IN HOME VISITS BY PHASE







Program dosage by phase






AGE AT CONCEPTION




Language proficiency plays a crucial role in building trusting relationships with clients and their understanding of the materials. In Sofia most of the Romanes speaking clients can speak and understand Bulgarian well, however, the Turkish speaking clients in Plovdiv can rarely speak or understand Bulgarian. Although nurses from Plovdiv took some Turkish lessons, they still need to use interpreters in their home visits, which is the role of the mediators working with that team.










One specific in the served community is that they consider themselves married even if they do not have marriage certificate but only have undergone the community's marriage rituals. There are legal reprimands for getting married if under certain age and some of the clients do not share what their marital status is. We have an option for those cases as well, where the client is not obliged to clarify whether they have a marriage certificate or not. For the last year, the married clients with certificate increased from 10% to 13% and percent of clients living with partner decreased from 51% to 43%.




EDUCATION LEVEL AT INTAKE








% of clients who have access to basic communal services by phase





Types of heating used in households by program phase









Infections during pregnancy (recorded after delivery)





Smoking patterns seem to be very different in Sofia and Plovdiv. Only 6 out of 78 clients in <u>Plovdiv</u> have smoked before the pregnancy and still smoke at intake, which is about 8% of all clients there. This is probably due to religious and cultural specifics of the communities served in Plovdiv. In <u>Sofia</u> on the other hand, 48% of the clients have smoked before the pregnancy and 42% continue to smoke at intake. There is a drop of 11% by the 36th gestation week and a reduction of the number of cigarettes smoked per day.



The percentage of women who have reported IPV has risen by 1% in Pregnancy 4th visit and by 2% in Infancy 12 gestation week. However, the number of women who have reported IPV in Pregnancy 4th visit has increased significantly since last year and in Infancy 12 months they have doubled, as shown in the table below.

CHILD HEALTH AND WELLBEING

BIRTH OUTCOMES

- 26% of children (50) are born before 38 gestation week
 - extremely preterm (less than 28 weeks) 1 child
 - very preterm (28 to 32 weeks) 2 children
 - moderate to late preterm (32 to 37 weeks)
 47 children
- 17% of children (33) have low birthweight (less than 2500 grams) – 21 of them are born preterm
- 33 (17%) infants spent on average 10 days in an NICU

- 6 pregnancy losses
 - 5 miscarriages
 - 1 medically indicated termination
- 3 child deaths
 - 1 baby died at four months due to an illness
 - 1 baby born with congenital heart defect died at three months
 - 1 extremely preterm baby (26th gestation week / 900 grams) — the baby died after a month in NICU

INJURIES

There have been only 2 hospitalizations - due to injury and burns, both before 6 months of the children, and 1 hospitalization for ingestion before 18 months.

Because of the health insurance status of the parents and discrimination towards Roma in the medical profession, our clients seek different paths when in need of medical assistance. We track all of them, including calling an ambulance without follow-up hospitalization.

Most injuries/ingestion cases are in the first six months of the child.




BREASTFEEDING




