David reflections	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - David not retiring officially for another 3-5 years - This meeting embodies collaboration and the way that NFP has been built over the years, drives home the message that we are stronger together. - Emphasizes what kind of value we place in transparency and accountability → sharing where we are collectively and what we plan to do to improve our collective and individual country functioning is reflective of our core values. - Keeping our clients at the heart of the work and improving lives of families. - We intend to evaluate the process as we go along → one more shadow meeting to be held in December. - Hoping that this work aligns with the sensibilities with how we will be doing this work!

Background from each country → Deirdre - intros - successes - challenges - Aspirations - variations on the program in each country -	Australia: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Claire highlighting that the program has been delivered since 2009 - Delivering now at 14 sites - Delivery is to First Nations community or women pregnant with a Torres Strait Islander baby - Applying lens of flexibility and not being afraid to adapt the program so it suits the participants best - Success: vaccination rates, leadership group that is the CEO of each site that meets 2-3x/year - Kym: Evolution of family partnership worker role over time Norway (Benedicte) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Started off in 2015, pilot began in 2016 - Now in phase 3 since 2021 - 5 sites currently covering total of 1.5 million people in total



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- Very specific criteria for participants to ensure reaching most vulnerable population
- Challenges: moving from various phases is challenging

Canada (Ontario)

- Jennifer here on behalf of Lindsay
- Ontario is single health unit who holds license for implementation for Ontario, different than BC (government oversight)
- 8 sites
- Strengths: collaboration cross-province → BC and now Nova Scotia
- Challenges: data collection & data base

Canada (Nova Scotia)

- Guidance from BC and Ontario in supporting NFP launch in Nova Scotia
- Funding from government to do full implementation across the province, beginning in one zone
- Consultation has begun with First Nation partners
- Rural context → how to bring this to communities where there aren't many births/year?

Northern Ireland

- Implementation began in 2010, now working at 5 sites.
- Success: Challenges with database in capturing all relevant data
- Aspirations: extend offer of program out → not limiting to younger age group

England:

- Delivering program since 2008
- Strengths: replication at scale
- Adapted program following RCT results, personalizing program to make it work for their community needs
- Unique materials used to ensure work is embedded in local systems.
- Challenges: sustainability

Scotland

- Program established in 2010
- Robust education and learning program
- Data always a challenge → balance between understanding what data is going to bring value to the program vs what data is a burden
- Natural experiment since 2016 → hopeful that that will publish at end of calendar year
