- More ownership of global NFP by all countries with ability to shape future direction and learn from, and support each other

- Continued strengthening of links between USA and other implementing countries

Prevention Research Center Co-Directors  
Delegated authority from University of Colorado to sign off licensing and contract arrangements for NFP. Lead US NFP research team. Dr Olds, as the program founder, also provides expertise on NFP for Global partners.

**NFP Global Collaborative Guidance Group (GCGG)**  
Made up of nominated members from each NFP-implementing country, the GCGG is responsible for assuring the quality of NFP replication across all implementing countries. The group oversees strategic direction and priorities for Global NFP and works with the Global Director to ensure that the arrangement for quality assurance and shared learning across countries are effective. Makes recommendations to PRC CO-Directors where license fidelity is compromised.

**Gail Radford-Trotter**  
NFP Global Consultant: provides individual consultation to implementing countries, supports Global Director, liaises with interested countries, facilitates CAG and Education Leads Forums.

**Deirdre Webb**  
NFP Global Director: responsible for developing strategic direction and expansion of NFP and ensuring that NFP Global Collaborative Guidance Group is working effectively to maintain quality of NFP in all implementing countries.

**Anna Lindberg**  
NFP Global Coordinator: Anna supports the team through administrative coordination, contract management, and NFP Global website support.

**Marlene Davis**  
PRC Finance Coordinator: manages NFP Global/PRC budgets, and oversees contracts between PRC and participating countries.

**Education Leads Advisory Group**  
A forum for those leading, developing and facilitating NFP Education across countries to discuss, explore and exchange information on education and curriculum issues.

**Clinical Advisory Group (CAG)**  
A forum in which international Clinical Leads can collaborate, and be updated on, clinical developments to enhance the quality of NFP.

**Global Research & Evaluation Group**  
This group led by Susan Jack is responsible for advancing Global NFP Research Priorities and promoting the dissemination and sharing of NFP Global research to advance policy and practice.

**Data Analytic Advisory Group**  
This group discusses and exchanges information on data analytic and reporting issues, shared learning to foster a learning community where participants examine challenges and examples of best practice.
